

Requirements

Even if the following conditions are satisfied, admission is based on selection by Yamaguchi University and is not guaranteed. The university will attempt to place students in their faculty or graduate school of choice, but this is not always possible. The faculty or graduate school which students enter must be consistent with the students' specialty in their own universities. The Faculty of Global and Science Studies is an exception and does not require any specific specialties.

We may reassign your faculty based on your study plan and the classes that you wish to take.

Enrollment Acceptance	Undergraduate students and Graduate students can be officially admitted only after being reviewed and approved by the department or laboratory of their chosen fields.

Minimum Language Requirements	<p>Faculties and graduate schools have Japanese language requirement or English language requirement. All students should take the Yamaguchi University Japanese Level Test at online application. If student has taken the JLPT test, we also require that student uploads the JLPT results on the online process. Higher one either the JLPT or Yamaguchi University Japanese Level Test score is taken automatically. If students have never studied Japanese, students can skip the Yamaguchi University Japanese Language Test. We tell the URL of the Yamaguchi University Japanese Level Test, student IDs and passwords to coordinator after complete all nomination procedure.</p> <p><u>Faculty of Global and Science Studies, Faculty of Medicine</u> Do not require an official language proficiency score, but students should have adequate proficiency to join courses that are taught in English and/or Japanese.</p> <p><u>Graduate School of Innovation and Technology Management</u> The school does not require any official Japanese language proficiency, but require TOEIC 800 or an equivalent English language level</p> <p><u>Faculties of Humanities, Education, Economics, Science, Agriculture, Engineering and Veterinary Medicine</u> Japanese level of JLPT N2 or higher</p> <p><u>Graduate School of Humanities and Economic Sciences (Division of Humanities and Division of Clinical Psychology)</u> Japanese level of JLPT N1</p> <p><u>Graduate School of Humanities and Economic Sciences (Division of Co-creation Sciences)</u> Japanese level of JLPT N2 or higher</p> <p><u>Graduate School of Humanities and Economic Sciences (Division of Economics and Management)</u> Students should meet one of the following requirements. 1. Japanese language classes	<p>The list for details https://www.yamaguchi-u.ac.jp/isc/wp-content/uploads/2024/12/JapaneseJapaneseStudies2025.pdf Japanese language classes are available for all Japanese levels and can be taken by exchange students regardless of faculty. However Japanese language classes should be taken in addition to the classes held by the faculty, not as the sole curriculum. And, there are not many Japanese language classes that exchange students of Tokiwa campus can attend, and Japanese language classes are not offered in Kogushi campus. Because of the distance and difficulty of transportation between campuses, taking courses on a different campus is discouraged.</p>

These courses may be updated in the future.</p> <p>This program consists of beginner level Japanese language classes, Japanese culture experience class, and classes in specialized fields.</p> <p>A certificate of completion will be issued upon completion of the designated credits.</p> <p>Students who wish to attend the program will be accepted by Yamaguchi University as special auditing students, and will mainly take the courses specified in the English program.</p> <p>However, depending on their Japanese language proficiency, they may also be able to take courses outside of the program.</p>

Other Points of Attention	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Exchange students are not able to take some of the courses. (e.g. experiment, practical training etc.) - The classes shown in the syllabus list and on the attached list of classes may not be available every year. - Students who will receive their degree from Yamaguchi University will be prioritized for all class placement. Class sizes may be limited based on the faculty or professor's decision. In this case priority for remaining seats will be decided based on knowledge related to the subject. - It is difficult to take classes on different campuses.

Required documents for Certificate of Eligibility (COE)	https://www.yamaguchi-u.ac.jp/isc/wp-content/uploads/2024/07/Required_documents_for_COE.pdf Yamaguchi University requires all exchange students or their supporter to submit a certificate of bank statement or an equivalent document that can satisfy the monthly living expense of approximately JPY100,000.
Visa procedures in your country	We will send a Certificate of Eligibility (COE) and a letter of acceptance from the president of YU to the exchange student. The exchange student should bring these to his or her country's Japanese Embassy or Consulate.
Health	
National Health Insurance required?	All international students on college student visas must register for the National Health Insurance program regardless of their intended period of stay. They will need to pay the insurance premiums for this insurance. However, when they receive any medical treatment, they will be required to pay only 30% of the total medical fee. The cost of the health insurance varies depending on income and place of residence. For singles with no income, it is approximately JPY20,000 for one year.
Yamaguchi University insurance required?	All students, including research students and auditors, must take out "Personal Accident Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research" (JPY1,000 per year) and "Personal Liability Insurance for Students in addition to the Disaster and Accident Insurance for Students" (JPY340 per year)
